LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

The institute provides a focused approach to support co-curricular leadership offerings. Students choose from a range of courses in leadership styles, communication tools, strategic planning, resume preparation, interviewing techniques, project development and business fundamentals and innovation in entrepreneurship.



CURRICULUM

While 100% of students participate in a college-preparatory curriculum with an expected level of rigor, flexibility and student choice are emphasized by offering multiple levels for each class: College Preparatory, Accelerated, Honors and Advanced Placement.

Maryvale offers many one-semester half-credit courses, permitting students to experience a traditional college class schedule as well as offer a broader array of courses across subject areas.

Students take seven courses per semester. Exceptions are allowed for students enrolled in three or more AP courses. In that case, students are permitted to take six courses per semester.

Beginning sophomore year, one section of AP Modern World History is offered (enrollment by teacher recommendation). Most often only one section of an AP course is offered; scheduling conflicts do sometimes restrict a student's ability to advance to the AP level in a subject.

Online courses are available to select students through Anne Arundel Community College and Virtual High School. The final grade and transcript for these online courses are provided by the institution. Maryvale does not award grades for these classes, but the final grade is included on the Maryvale transcript and computed in a student's GPA calculation.

MARYVALE'S SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

Leadership Scholars are selected to participate in a structured program which requires successful completion of four core courses, additional service hours above the graduation requirement as well as a final Capstone Project. A Leadership Certificate of completion is awarded at graduation.

STEAM (STEM + Art) Scholars have the opportunity to develop a highly personalized exploration of diverse STEAM topics. Hands-on experiences are infused through the curriculum at every grade level. Students are not limited to a specific STEAM track, but instead pursue a path based on their interests to set them up for success in college and their future careers. Participants are required to complete a final Capstone Project.

Visual Arts Scholars are those students who have a dedication to visual arts. Scholars enroll in additional art electives in both freshman and sophomore years. Successful completion of four credits of Visual Arts coursework and development of a final portfolio are program requirements. Certificate of completion awarded at graduation.

Performing Arts Mastery Program is designed for students who excel in performing arts. The program includes two completed course credits in performing arts, design and implementation of a Capstone Project to benefit the Maryvale performing arts community and a portfolio that encapsulates the student's Performing Arts experience at Maryvale. Certificate of completion awarded at graduation.

The Ford Program is designed to help students navigate their coursework while strengthening their organization, time management and study skills. Through direct instruction, students gain critical tools to support academic success in high school as well as college. Enrolled students are provided individualized assistance. To receive program services, students must supply a full-scale psycho-educational evaluation documenting ADHD, math and/or Executive Function challenges in order to be considered for this fee-based course.

The St. Julie Billiart Program serves college-bound students with diagnosed language-based learning differences. SJB students receive instruction from experienced learning specialists using proven instructional methods, allowing them to successfully navigate our college-preparatory curriculum.
